

Take the tops off your ornaments and place them on the cups so they don't roll.



Using a wider flat brush, paint in white snow drifts.



Mix white and black together to make gray. Use more white than black.



Paint the sky gray. Blow dry and recoat the white snow and then the sky. Repeat this 2-3 times.



Using a smaller pointed brush start your trees using black.

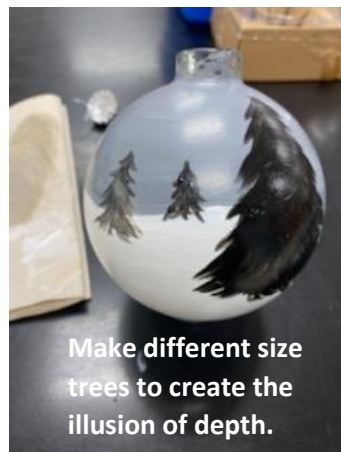


Repeat the.

Continue to flare out your tree. It should get wider as it goes down.



Make sure the tree touches the snow.



Make different size trees to create the illusion of depth.



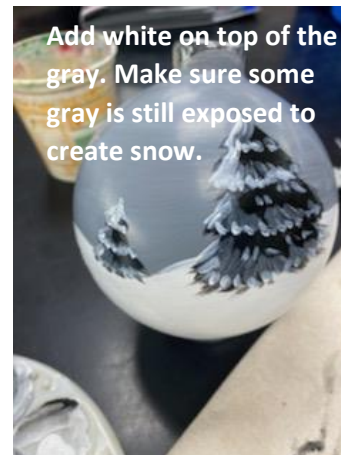
After 2 coats of black paint, with your brush still dirty, grab gray paint.



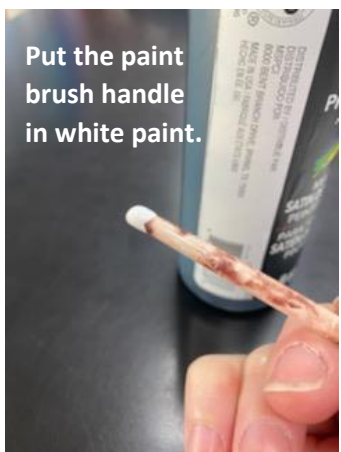
With the black paint still wet, add in the gray paint.



Make small little hash marks all the way across the tree.



Add white on top of the gray. Make sure some gray is still exposed to create snow.



Put the paint brush handle in white paint.



Use it as a dotter for snow.



Dot it in the sky and over the trees too.

All Done! To seal the paint, place them in a muffin tin. Make sure the paint is dry first. **Place them in the oven WITH THE OVEN OFF. NO PREHEATING.** Turn the oven on to 350 degrees, set the timer for 25 minutes. When the timer goes off, take out, let them cool and place the metal toppers back on.
